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TORONTO TOPICS.

A Building Collapse—The Henry Garbutt Extradition—The Street Railway.

Toronto, Aug. 24.—W. G. Murdoch, of the Toronto bar, has been interviewed by the Washington Post on the subject of the attempted extradition of Harry Garbutt, of Wingham, now in jail in Toronto. He concludes a long interview as follows: "I am able to prove that my client was at his home in Wingham, thousands of miles away from the Texas town, on March 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, 1891, though it was on the 2nd of that month that the forgeries were perpetrated by the alleged cattle buyer Huntley. I can prove this by no less than twenty of the best people in my client's town. Our general elections occurred on March 5, and Garbutt was observed by numerous witnesses to be taking an active interest in the voting on that day. If he had been in Texas on March 2 he could not have been working the polls in Wingham on March 5. Our extradition laws, however, are construed with the utmost liberality toward the foreign country, and all that has to be done is to make out a prima facie case against a man and he has no way to escape imprisonment. I carried Garbutt's case on a habeas corpus writ before Judge Street, of Toronto, who would hear no argument, holding that the question of alibi is a matter for the Texas courts. Neither will he be taken for one charged with an offense subjecting him to extradition. A peculiar incident is that no true bill against Garbutt has been found by a Texas grand jury nor any warrant issued against him down there. Governor Hogg's requisition must come here to receive the signature of the Secretary of State. I have laid out all the facts before the State Department, but should Mr. Blaine sign the warrant I will continue my fight before our Minister of Justice at Ottawa. Failing there I shall take the case to the Dominion Court of Appeals."
