Hamilton, March 16.—The fourteenth annual covention of the Dominion Council of the Royal Templats of Temperance of the Dominion of Canada and Newfoundland, which opened at the court house yesterday morning, will probably last four days, although the business may be completed sooner.

The annual report called upon the members to make suggestions along new lines that might catch the ears of the legislators, and to do everything possible to advance the cause. 
