

## RELEASE IRISH PRISONERS IN LONDON JAILS

The British Authorities Issue Amnesty Proclamation Granting Freedom to

PASS "ACT OF OBLIVION"

Months May Be Required To Return All Troops To England.

London, England, Jan. 13.—The Irish olitical prisoners in the London jails, Brixton, Pentonville and Wormwood Scrubs, were released this morning, under the amnesty proclamation issued by King George yesterday. Instruc-tions were sent to the provincial jails for similar releases. The first prisoner o be released under the amnest proclamation, Dr. McConville of Mon-aghan, left Mountjoy yesterday. Dub-lin Castle has Issued a list of 370 prisoners for release today. Five persons were liberated from Mountjoy and 38 from Limerick Prison yesterday.

#### **Amnesty Declaration** Elicits Enthusiasm

Dublin, Jan. 13.—Materialization of the earnestly desired amnesty of political prisoners in Ireland has elicited more outward enthusiasm here than any other development in the peace activities. It may be remarked in passing that the choice of the phrase, "act of oblivion," rather than "act of clemency," in the official announce-ment, was recognized as a happy dip-lomatic stroke, the significance of which was not missed.

Indulge in Demonstrations.

Dublin citizens included in lively demonstrations last night, a large crowd outside Mountjoy Prison welcoming the successive batches of librated prisoners with loud cheers, while a happy atmosphere generally pervaded the streets. Similar scenes were enacted in Cork and Limerick, where thers were released. It is understood that a number of men freed from pris-ons in England will arrive today.
