

GARTSHORE GIVES VICTORIA OFFICES

Generous Donation Will Permit Enlargement of Administration Building.

Donation of \$70,000 for the improvement of the administration building at Victoria hospital will be made by Colonel William M. Gartshore, chairman of the hospital trust. Announcement of Col. Gartshore's gift was made at a hospital trust meeting last week, prior to the colonel's departure to California and Honolulu.

Upon Colonel Gartshore's orders tentative plans for the rearrangement of the business offices at the hospital are being drawn up by Watt and Blackwell, architects. The actual construction will not be commenced, however, until the colonel's return from the south. He left London last Friday that he might take a rest cure of several months.

So earnest is Col. Gartshore in his desire to perfect the present hospital that he insured against the possibility of his death during his trip to Honolulu by providing for the \$70,000 donation in his will.

Record of Devoted Service.

For many years Col. Gartshore has given devoted service in conducting hospital business and shown a personal interest in the activities of all connected with the institution. Some months ago he had a siege of illness which confined him to the hospital for several weeks. It was while an invalid there that he realized the blessing some form of entertainment would be, and it was not long before every ward was equipped with separate radio sets.

Realizing the imperative need of new administration buildings through his personal experience with the business of the institution, and knowing also that an expenditure for improvements of the nature would receive secondary consideration from civic spending bodies, the colonel formed his intention several months ago of making a personal donation that Victoria hospital might be immediately elevated to a higher standard of efficiency.

Present plans call for an operating room near the front entrance on the second floor, doing away with the present room, renovating and enlarging the offices and constructing and equipping new kitchens.

JUNIOR FARMERS JUDGES OF STOCK

Special Course in Grading Is Held in Packing House at Ingersoll.

Ingersoll, Dec. 17.—Increased interest was evidenced today in the 20 junior farmers from the counties of Oxford, Essex, Kent, Elgin, Lambton, Middlesex, Norfolk, Perth and Waterloo, in the special educational course in swine breeding, conducted at the Ingersoll Packing Company, under the auspices of the Canadian Swine Breeders' association, the Canadian meat packers, and the dominion and provincial department of agriculture.

The forenoon was devoted to a judging and grading competition in live hogs, the large class having an opportunity to put into practice the information gleaned from helpful lectures given yesterday afternoon. The special course is under the direction of H. E. Todd, secretary industrial and development council of the Canadian meat packers, Toronto. J. A. Carroll, Toronto, assistant director agricultural representative, is also in attendance. The various teams of junior farmers are accompanied by their district agricultural representatives. The class made a trip of inspection through the plant, being piloted by the superintendent, E. McIvor.

The judges today were: J. D. Brien, of Ridgeway, representing the Swine Breeders' association; Prof. J. C. Steckley, of the O.A.C., Guelph, and Gavin Barbour, hog grader, dominion livestock department. The prizewinners will be announced tomorrow.

Features this afternoon were a lecture on "Animal Diseases and Meat Inspection," by Dr. J. A. McIntosh, of the veterinary general branch, Ottawa, and a lecture and demonstration on lamb carcasses by James A. Toifer, district sheep promoter, dominion livestock branch, Paris. The course will be concluded tomorrow.

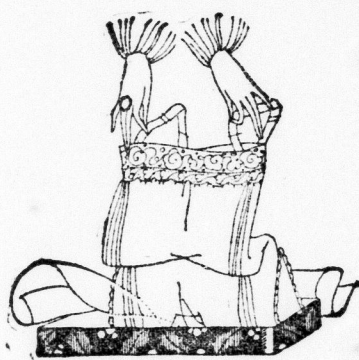
Lansing, Mich., Dec. 17.—Sixty men will be added at once to the prohibition forces patrolling the international boundary from Port Huron to Lake Erie. It was announced here today. Forty of these men will be Michigan state police officers. The rest will be supplied by the federal prohibition administrator. The augmented force will be maintained until after January 17.

Allan G. Straght, commissioner of public safety and head of the Michigan state police, today said that his men, operating on Lake St. Clair and the St. Clair river, are making large seizures of liquor daily, but that these seizures mean "virtually nothing" when compared with the total operations of rum-runners.
