THE LATE MAYOR GRAYBILL'S FUNERAL.

The largest funeral ever seen in Waterloo was that of the late Mayor Graybill. It was fitting and right that his obsequies should be impressive. Since Waterloo was incorporated as a town, no mayor has died in harness, and the citizens recognized that this was a fitting occasion to show their respect to the head of the town.

Everything was done in a solemn, impressive manner. The Reverends Mr. Wing, Mr. Hockey and W. Lee, all took part in the proceedings. Mr. Wing speaking in the house and Mr. Hockey conducted the outside services, and spoke in appreciative terms of our late mayor. Mr. Lee gave the benediction and also referred to Mr. Graybill's well-known fine felicitations. The funeral was well attended by representative citizens from Waterloo and Berlin. We noticed five ex-mayors, viz.: Jacob Uffelman, Geo. Moore, E. F. Seagram and J. N. Fisher. Mr. W. L. Mackenzie King, Dominion Minister of Labour, was also present, and J. B. Hughes, Mayor Schmalz, from Berlin, was present, heading a representative delegation from Berlin Town Council. The Waterloo Musical Society Band was out to a man, and played the Dead March in "Saul" (Handel) very impressively.

The spontaneous expression of feeling shown to-day was striking. It showed that the late Mayor Levi Graybill has the respect of all classes of the community. The Canadian people are not very demonstrative until too late, and if the late Mr. Graybill could have heard the eulogies passed on him (and all true) perhaps he would have borne the cares of office a little bit lighter.

Waterloo paid its best respects possible.

RECEPTION TO LAURIER.

Return of Premier Will Be Greatest Ever, Say Organizers.

Montreal, July 3.—The reception to be given to Sir Wilfrid Laurier on his return to Canada next Monday will eclipse any demonstration ever witnessed to a Canadian Prime Minister.

Already plans have been made for the illumination of the river, St. Helen's Island, of the Champ de Mars, and the principal streets of the city through which the Premier, accompanied by Hon. L. P. Brodeur and possibly Sir Frederick Borden, will drive to the station early in the morning.

Leaving the Empress of Britain at Quebec on Saturday or Sunday evening, Sir Wilfrid will come up the river in a private yacht, arriving here about 7 o'clock Monday morning.

Deputations from the Reform, Lemieux, Bickerdike, Westmont Liberal, St. Lawrence Liberal, Chénier, Prefecture and Laurier political clubs, will meet the party at Victoria Pier, which will be tastefully decorated and illuminated for the occasion by the harbor commission.

British firms are reported to have been awarded tenders for building Canadian Dreadnoughts.

John A. McCausland, an aged and respected resident of Aylmer, hanged himself in his woods.

Christ Church Cathedral at St. John, N.B., was struck by lightning and burned, only the walls being left.

John Holland, aged about 50 years, was drowned in the River Nith at Hamburg, Ont., while bathing about nine o'clock last night.

Mayor Seidel of Milwaukee announces that the Social Administration in that city saved \$500 in the printing bill by taking the names of dead men off the voting list.

A Baltimore Presbyterian congregation is divided on the question of disapproving the Chinese Sunday school as the result of a twenty-year-old girl marrying her Chinese pupil.

The London Express says it understands that the prime of high commissioner for Canada in London has been offered to Sir Frederick Borden, Minister of Militia and Defence in the Laurier Cabinet.

W. T. Stead, editor and author, at the July 4th meeting in London, said that to no man did the British Empire owe a greater debt than to Geo. Washington, "the greatest Englishman of the eighteenth century."

Though Roman Catholics knelt around him when there was a Corpus Christi procession at Rockland, Ontario, J. Miller refused to take off his hat. Threatened since, he has carried a revolver, and now a charge has been laid against him.

Wouldn't Hear Local Man.

Melville, Sask., July 3.—An unusual turn was given to the meeting at Melville yesterday afternoon. Mr. Borden was given an enthusiastic personal reception and his arguments were accorded attentive hearing. His policy of western expansion elected frequent cheers. The utterances on reciprocity were heard in quietness, though they were not often applauded, but when a western Conservative Harvey Beard of Winnipeg, Sask., and formerly of Nova Scotia, began to argue the same issue it speedily brought down a storm of interruptions, antagonistic and favorable, and the chairman was compelled to ask for order.

The western people gave their visitors a polite and attentive hearing, but they felt Mr. Borden, who is to be a Conservative candidate of Humboldt at the next election, as one of their own, and they treated him accordingly.
