HERE'S HOW AND WHEN  
TO GET SEE HALL'S COMET

If you get up just before sunrise  
April 8, or thereabouts, you will get  
a glimpse of Halley's comet in the  
Eastern sky, says Prof. John N.  
Stockwell, famous American astron-  
omer. From that time it will be  
visible for two hours and a half be-  
fore sunrise. AFTER MIDNIGHT, we  
won't have to lose any morning  
hours sleep to see it. It will be  
visible in the western sky after sun-  
set. You see, Prof. Stockwell thinks  
we will be still here to see it after  
May 18.  
He says the comet will blaze in  
the night sky far into the summer,  
and lovers may sit in the comet  
light and promise each other to fly  
through eternity together. It will  
steadily grow smaller and glimmer  
as it shoots away from the sun on  
the side of the solar system opposite  
us. At its largest, the comet will  
appear as large as the sun to us,  
says Prof. Stockwell.
