FREDERICTON TROTTER PARK.

The Programme for the Opening Meeting.

The Board of Directors of the Fredericton Trotter Park Association, announces the completion of their track buildings and grounds, and that the Park will be opened with a free day on Wednesday, September 25th and 26th, September, 1887, from 10 o'clock to 4 o'clock, and will be offered for the following classes:

First Day—Foals of 1884, or younger, 1200; 3 minute class, \$120; 2 1/2 class, \$175.

Second Day—2 1/2 class, \$150; 2 3/4 class, \$250; running race, open to all, \$250.

Class 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 will be trotting, to harness, mile heats, 3 in 5, and will be governed by the rules of the National Trotting Association. No. 9 will be running, mile heats, and will be governed by the rules of the American Jockey Club.

In each race the entrance fee will be 10 per cent of the purse, and must be paid on the day named. No condition entries will be accepted.

All entries must be addressed to W. P. Flaveling, P. O. Box 73, Fredericton, N. B., and the same will be closed at the Queen Hotel at 10 o'clock on Thursday evening the 25th Sept. next. Entries will be divided 80 per cent to first, 30 per cent to second, and 10 per cent to third. At least four horses to enter, and three to start in each race.

The Directors reserve the right to postpone the races, should bad weather occur on the day named. The Government Stallions are stabled on the grounds, and may be seen by all. Among them are the noted stallions, Harry Wilkes, No. 1886, and Aurora, No. 1884. Beside these are full bred Cleveland Bays, Clydesdales, Percherons, and the thoroughbred running horse, Sir Peter.

The best of order will be enforced, and reserved seats in the Grand Stand will be provided for ladies. Admission 50 cents each, Grand Stand 10 cents, carriage free.

CITY IMPROVEMENTS.

A Sketch of some Important Works.

City improvements are being rapidly made, the most important one being the new asphalt sidewalk on the east side of Queen street. The foundation for the block from Westmorland street to Phoenix Square, is completed, and a gang of workmen under Mr. Richardson, are putting down the curbing to-day on the block included between the County Court House and Mr. Temple's residence.

Along Officers' Square, Mr. William Roseborough is erecting the retaining wall for the new fence, and when this is completed the sidewalk will be laid, this work being done by the Dominion Government under Mr. F. S. Elyard's inspection. The new sidewalk along the south side of Regent street, from King to Brunswick, was laid some time ago, ready for the asphalt covering. The condition of Myhr's Alley for a long time has been anything but creditable, and this week the necessary repairs were made at that locality. One of the best jobs done by the city this year is that on Carleton street, from the Bridge to King street. Ald. Parker, chairman of the Road Committee, and Roadmaster Casey, receiving great credit for the excellence of the work. Mr. Richardson, who has the contract for extensive repairs to the Hill & Barry wharf, has commenced operations. The repairs of the Central House Station, under Ald. Limerick's supervision, are well advanced, and it is now presented a very nice appearance, and in keeping with the other house stations. A most necessary part of the city's improvement is the new sewer on the east side of driving towards No. 4 House Station, Queen's Ward.
