A MISSING MERCHANT

Warrant Out for the Arrest of C. S. Herbert

FOR DEFRAUDING HIS CREDITORS Got Away With \$20,000 in Hard

Cash. September With a Few Thousand Dol lars, Leased An Immense Building and Opened Up a Drygoods Emporium

the Dollar and Made a Sudden Exit Clinton S. Herbert, drygoods merchant, missing, and a warrant is in the hands of the Detective Department for his ar-

rest on a charge of disposing of his goods with intent to defraud his creditors. Herbert came to the city last August from Detroit, with capital variously estimated at \$7000. and \$10,000. He leased the building at Shuter-Yonge streets, at that time occupied by Mr. C. H. Henderson as an auction mart, paying Mr. Henderson \$1000 and taking

over the unexpired lease.

Herbert stocked the premises with Herbert stocked the premises with \$30,000 or \$40,000 worth of goods, and apparently did a good business. Since Jan. 1, however, he has been falling behind in his payments and on Saturday, night discharged almost one-half of his clerks. Yesterday, he disposed of his entire stock to Mr. Nicholas Garland, buyer of bankrupt stocks, at 40 cents on the dollar, receiving \$9000 in cash, and left the city on the 4.55 train. It is estimated that he took with him in addition about \$11,000, the proceeds of sales during the past four weeks, or a total of \$20,000.

Herbert's liabilities are probably \$30,000. The principal creditors are in Montreal, S. Greenshields, Son & Co. and Thibauleau, Bros. & Co., heing heavy losers.
