Bakers' grades are bringing 23s to 23s 9d delivered in the United Kingdom. Within that range it is possible to sell large amounts for export. Few patents have gone to Europe from

the 1888 crop, but with a cheaper and better new crop of wheat, better results are looked for in the future. A few weeks of good weather will put the crop in condition for milling, when more active business is expected. Some country milis say they are grinding new wheat almost alone and some make no mixture with old and claim good results. A very superior production of flour is well assured.

Quotations at the mills for car or round lots are: Patents, \$5.10@5.35; second patents, \$4.55@5.10; bakers', \$3.25@3.50, in barrels; best low grades, \$1.50@1.90, in bags; red dog, \$1.15@1.40 in bags.
