A STUDY IN A STORY.

"Nicholas Minturn," Dr. Holland's latest story, which
 has been followed with so much interest by thousands
 of readers during its publication in *Belford's*, is now
 ready in book form. In the volume Dr. Holland has
 added a few words to the title, which he aptly calls "A
 Study in a Story." In this story the author not only has
 attempted to show the effect upon character, both in the
 upper and the lower classes, of a loss of self-respect, but
 he has made, in addition, a "Study" of a social problem
 which may be said to be peculiarly timely.

The elucidation of the pauper and tramp question
 forms, in fact, a leading theme of the book; for, like
 Dr. Holland's other stories, this is "novel with a pur-
 pose." A large part lies in the relations of Nicholas,
 the hero, to the "dead beats" of a great city and the ex-
 traordinary experiments in their reclamation.

But there are one or two love stories involved, and Dr.
 Holland has given his readers some characters evidently
 studied from life, and not from books, namely, Mr. B. S-
 oon, who is the tragic figure on the scene, Mrs. Costes,
 and Capt. Hanks, that "hard-working and slow-saving
 man."
