

Awards

The CIIPS Awards Programme is administered by the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada under Institute supervision. In 1987/88 there were two levels of awards valued at up to \$14,000 and up to \$25,000. The programme encourages expertise and scholarship in the field of international peace and security and the development of contacts with the international community by supporting Canadians who wish to pursue their studies in institutions abroad or, exceptionally, in Canada.

Thirty-four applications were received for the first year of the programme and the names of award holders may be found at Annex I. As of 31 March, 53 applications had been received and were being considered for the 1988/89 awards.

At its meeting in March 1988, the Board of Directors decided to extend this two year experimental programme and to increase the number of awards from seven to ten. At the same meeting it was also agreed to introduce a new programme of three scholarships at \$2,500 each for study at a North American-European Summer School in Austria.

Bursaries

The special and modest bursary programme introduced in 1986/87 was a success. Its purpose is to assist individuals in activities related to the mandate of the Institute which do not fall within the purview or criteria of the other programmes. Each bursary is for a maximum of \$500.

Twenty-six requests were received of which eleven were granted. The list of recipients appears at Annex H.
