

A SINGLE, ELEGANT STANDARD Wherever you travel in North America, your electric shaver works. Standardization of electric current, at 60 cycles and 110 volts, is so universal that it's hard to believe there was ever a time when it wasn't.

Similarly, a standard has emerged for the handling of graphic information by computers and related equipment. This standard is called NAPLPS – the North American Presentation Level Protocol Syntax. NAPLPS is known in Canada as Telidon, first proposed in the 1970s as a way of encoding videotex databases. Telidon and NAPLPS are identical.
