Application forms for Canadian passports are available at passport offices, Canadian diplomatic and consular missions abroad, travel agencies, and the North West Company through its network of Northern Stores in communities in the Far North. There are separate forms for adults and children, both available in English or French. You should allow at least three weeks for delivery of your passport.
