

of restrictions at the municipal level or through intimidation. The South African government's public commitment to end apartheid should be accompanied by vigorous action to ensure that all citizens of South Africa are given full access, as a basic right, to public facilities throughout the country.

"We sincerely hope that the next session of Parliament in South Africa will see substantial progress in the repeal of other discriminatory legislation, notably the Group Areas and the Land Acts which impose residential segregation. The repeal of these pillars of apartheid are the litmus test of the government's commitment to peaceful democratic change in South Africa," said Mr. Clark.
