PRAYERS.

Ninety-five petitions for private bills were presented in accordance with Standing Order 70(1).

Mr. Churchill, seconded by Mr. Fleming (Eglinton), by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-33, An Act to amend the Public Servants Inventions Act, which was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

On motion of Mr. Argue, seconded by Mr. Herridge, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, telegrams, reports and other documents exchanged between any Cabinet Minister and his or her Deputies, and any other Department of the Government, and any person or persons since 1950, regarding resignations and transfers of employees of the National Museum of Canada.
