PRAYERS.

Mr. Francis, from the Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs, presented the First Report of the said Committee, which is as follows;

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Thursday November 6, 1969, your Committee has considered Bill C-8, An Act to amend the Children of War Dead (Education Assistance) Act, and has agreed to report it without amendment.

A copy of the Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence relating to this Bill (Issue No. 1) is tabled.

(The Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence accompanying the said Report recorded as Appendix No. 1 to the Journals).

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale), seconded by Mr. Olson, it was ordered,—That the Standing Committee on Health, Welfare and Social Affairs be empowered to study the subject-matter of tobacco advertising;

That the Orders for second reading of Bills C-34, C-69, and C-70 be discharged, and the subject-matter thereof be referred to the Committee; and

That the evidence adduced by the Committee in its study of the subjectmatter of Bills C-39, C-45, C-53, C-134, C-137 and C-147 in the First Session of the Twenty-Eighth Parliament be referred to the Committee.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Benson, seconded by Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale),—That Bill C-7, An Act to authorize the provision of moneys to meet certain capital expenditures of the Canadian National Railways
