FARM CREDIT CORPORATION OFFICE MOVE, B.C.

Question No. 280-Mr. McLennan:

1. What was the reason for moving the farm credit corporation office from New Westminster, B.C., to Kelowna, B.C.?
2. Where is Kelowna in relation (a) to the centre

of the province (b) to the largest agriculture

production area?

3. How many employees found it necessary to resign their positions on account of the office being moved?

4. What percentage of the employees of the New Westminster office were displaced, or resigned, by the move?

Answer by: Hon. Alvin Hamilton (Minister of Agriculture):

1. The farm credit corporation office was moved from New Westminster, B.C. to Kelowna, B.C. to provide improved service to loan applicants and for economy of administration.

As shown in the following statement, sixty Total per cent of the loans and loan applications in British Columbia are in the interior of the province.

Nine of the corporations field offices in British Columbia are located in the interior of the province as compared to four in the Valley and Vancouver island. It is more advantageous and economical to supervise these from Kelowna than from New Westminster.

2. (a) Kelowna is approximately 350 miles southeast of Vanderhoof which is considered the geographical centre of British Columbia.

(b) Most of British Columbia's agricultural production comes from that portion of the province lying between Cranbrook in the east and New Westminster in the west and from the international border to just north of Kamloops. Kelowna is situated almost exactly in the centre of this area and is well served with road communications to each of the corporation's field offices within this general agricultural area and the more sparsely settled agricultural areas in the north and northwest of the province.
