REHIRING OF JEAN ROBERT OUELLET

Question No. 1,029-Mr. Valade:

- 1. Did the Minister of Manpower and Immigration rehire Jean Robert Ouellet, who was a candidate in the constituency of Sainte-Marie at the federal election of June 25, last and, if so, what are his present duties?
- 2. If Mr. Ouellet was not rehired by the Minister, was he hired by another department and by which department?
- 3. What is his present salary and what was his salary for the position he held prior to the last election?

Hon. Allan J. MacEachen (Minister of Manpower and Immigration): The answer for

the Department of Manpower and Immigration is as follows: 1. Mr. Jean Robert Ouellet was granted leave without pay from noon of May 17 to June 26, 1968, which was approved by the Public Service Commission in accordance with Section 32(3) of the Public Service Employment Act. He returned to his former position, Manpower Consultative Service Representative, in the Quebec Region.

- 3. His salary prior to the last election was \$13,303. His present salary is \$13,908, which includes an annual statutory increase to the second step in the scale of rates for his occupational group and level.
