ROYAL CANADIAN MINT FUNDS

Question No. 2,068-Mr. Cossitt:

With reference to the answer to question No. 1,594 which states in part, that the Royal Canadian Mint, under the direction of Mr. Yvon Gariépy, paid Le Cercle Universitaire d'Ottawa \$14,822.41 and that this was not paid from public funds (a) what funds does the Royal Canadian Mint possess that would enable it to pay this account from other than public funds (b) were public funds reimbursed for the amount involved and, if so (i) what are all the details of the amounts and persons concerned (ii) what are the dates of reimbursement?

Hon. J.-J. Blais (Minister of Supply and Services): I am informed by the Royal Canadian Mint as follows:

- (a) Section 2 of the Financial Administration Act defines "public money" and "public officer". Officers of the Royal Canadian Mint, including the chief executive officer, are not "public officers" and the funds managed by the Royal Canadian Mint are not "public money." The Royal Canadian Mint is financially autonomous and accountable to its board of directors for compliance with its approved budgets which are self financed and not subjected to parliamentary approval.

- 1. Effective April 30, 1981, five GS-PRC-4 security guards were declared surplus. The projected dollar savings are \$34,191 per annum.
- 2. Yes, costs were fully considered, including 2.5 per cent Department of Supply and Services contract fees. Pre-planning phase, selection process and the administration and evaluation phase were carried out within ongoing personnel services without additional costs.
