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feeling too ill that day to ask anyone to
come see me, was spending the day
having a test, X Ray and the intervals
between in a tub of hot water to
reduce the pain somewhat. I was so
lonely for a moment that I called
up your Home to wish you well, but
you were away.

Nov 11/18 - I was with No. 1. C. C. S.
at Aubereant (?) of a name rather like
that, we cared for the last Casualties
from Mons. both military - Civilians and
Enemy. Worked in operating Room for
43 hrs out of 48. so busy and
tired none of us believed there was
an armistice!

Col Bennett told me that No. 1 C.C.S.
had the honor of going to the Rhine with
Army of Occupation, because we had
ample surgical dressings ready for quick
make and many staps. for 10-20 days
enroute to care for Men as they could
be moved down or feet out on march
forward - It is the Army of Fate
that my "Preparedness" then, has cost me
