to have been much the same as I have described them in the Appendix to my voyage.

In the latitude of 46° on the coast of Patagonia, Mr. Brisbane succeeded in killing an animal of the lion species, though not before he had destroyed a large bull dog. The skin, together with the skull, was brought home and given to the museum of Edinburgh college. Professor Jamieson characterises the animal as having been an individual of the species Felis Concolor, or Puma, sometimes called the American lion.

Mr. Brisbane continued his voyage in the acquisition of his cargo till the 15th of January, when he shaped his course for England, and on the 29th of March he arrived in the Downs, after an absence of about eighteen months.
