In bestowing this gift upon the cor-

poration organized especially to receive it and apply its income to the purposes indicated, Mr. Carnegie, in a statement given out at his home to-night, said, he intended to leave with the corporate body work of found-n; and alding libraries and educational institutions, which he as an in-dividual has carried on for many years. 

OPTICAL ILLUSIONS CONCERNING HEAVENLY BODIES.

The apparent enlargement of the sun and the full moon when near the horizon has been explained as an optical illusion, due probably to some consideration of distance in comparing the heavenly bodies with terrestrial objects

in the same field of view.

Another suggestion has been that the atmosphere has a magnifying effect, and to test this theory, photographs have been made at Flammarion's observatory by Quenimet, of comet fame. Pictures of the sun were taken at two-minute intervals and an exposure of two hours showed the moon as a long streak of light. There was no enlargement near the horizon, but instead the lessened light caused a slight diminution in apparent size.


