LIVES \$25,000,000 FOR DIFFUSION OF KNOWLEDGE

Andrew Carnegie Hands Over to Corporate Body Work of Aiding Educational Institutions.

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—Andrew Carnegie to-night announced that he had given \$25,000,000 to the Carnegie Corporation of New York, organized here to-day under a charter granted by the New York Legislature last June, "to promote the advancement and diffusion of knowledge and understanding among the people of the United States."

In bestowing this gift upon the corporation organized especially to receive it and apply its income to the purposes indicated, Mr. Carnegie, in a statement given out at his home to-night, said, he intended to leave with the corporate body work of founding and aiding libraries and educational institutions, much as shall from time to time be found appropriate thereafter.

The incorporators met at Mr. Carnegie's house Friday afternoon, Nov. 10, 1911, according to the charter, adopted the constitution and bylaws, and elected the following officers: President, Andrew Carnegie; vice-president, Elihu Root; treasurer, Robert A. Frazer; secretary, James Bertram. Mr. Carnegie, in his statement to the corporation, for its corporate purposes twenty-five millions of dollars par value first mortgage gold bonds of the United States Steel Corporation. "It is intended that the business of founding and aiding libraries and educational institutions, which had been carried on by Mr. Carnegie as an individual for many years, will be turned over to the corporation at an early date and carried on by the corporation."
