DETERMINED TO EMPLOY TO END LIFE ON STREET

Donald Manson Gashes Throat and Fights Doctors Who Attend Printer's Sudden Death.

HAMILTON, June 25.—(Special.)—M. A. Piggott, contractor, won his hard-fought suit against the Federal Life and Canadian White Company. He brought suit against these two companies for \$20,000, because, while the excavation for the new Federal Life building was being made, the wall of his Commercial Centre building fell down.

The defendants brought a counter suit against him for \$10,000. Chief Justice Meredith, after spending 10 days of days in hearing evidence, this afternoon dismissed the defendant's counter suit, with costs, and ruled that the companies were liable. He left it to Judge Snider to fix the amount of damages.
