Belonging to Wife -Bail Refused.

WALKERTON, Aug. 24.-Martin Hansen, formerly of Greenwich Township, has been committed for trial by Magistrate Tolten on a charge of arson. Ball has been refused and the accused is confined to jail until his trial.

Evidence brought out at the preliminary hearing snowed that the accused and his wife had not got along well for some years. About a year ago Hanson assigned all property to his wife and left the district. On the right of August 1 the barn was burned and Hanson is charged with the offence. 
