envelope. When the box is opened the nominee of the majority of the parish delegates is endorsed upon the envelope and counted as the vote of the parish.

A majority of both clergy and laity

Half an hour must elapse between ballots, to give an opportunity for discussion outside.

Toronto is within two of being the smallest diocese in Canada, only Ontario and Huron being smaller. Toronto Diocese was founded in 1839. It has an area of 1080 square miles, its greatest breadth being 84 miles and greatest length 120 miles. This holds a population of 584,000, of whom 35,187 are Anglicans. The diocese is subdivided into eight rural deaneries, viz.: West

Simcoe, Peel, East Simcoe, West York, East York, Durham, Northumberland and Haliburton.

Service in Cathedral.

The musical portion of the service at St. James' Cathedral will be of an interesting nature. At 10.30 a.m. sharp the procession of canons, archdeacons and other members of the clergy, together with the choir of boys and as many chorists of St. James as are available, will march from the vestry to the chancel with His Lordship Bish-

op Reeve, D.D., and Ven. Archdeacon Sweeney, who has entire charge of all the arrangements of the synod, at the rear.

Dr. Albert E. Ham has full charge of the musical arrangements. The litany will be sung by one of the priests of St. James' Cathedral, and the celebration of the holy communion, which immediately follows, will be of the usual type associated with the usages of St. James' Cathedral. Maundy G. will be used for the communion

music, while the "Gloria in Excelsis" will be sung by the vast body of clergy and laity present to the ordinary plain song of the church.

The choir will remain to the close of this service, for which no tickets are required, the general public being welcome. The whole service concludes with the Nunc Dimittis, sung in recitation.
