

Wheat Rises After Early Bulge Weather Conditions Improve

Chicago Market Subject to Erratic Fluctuations—Sentiment Ruled by Weather Reports From Wheat Belt.

Liverpool wheat futures closed to-day 1/4 higher than yesterday, corn 1/4 higher, and July wheat at Chicago closed 1/4 lower than yesterday, July corn 1/4 lower, and July oats 1/4 higher.

Snow's Report.
Show writes from Lake, North Dakota: To-day the worst yet. High temperatures and strong south wind fairly burning up grain crops. No moisture in soil and small portions of resistance. Thus, Pierce, Benson and Ramsey counties this forenoon, plant very small and stand thin, as are crops in dunes. Thin land and hill tops already show dying wheat. A few days more like this will spell disaster.

ST. LAWRENCE MARKET.
Receipts of farm produce at the St. Lawrence Market on Saturday were 100 bushels of grain, 10 loads of hay and many buggies and light wagon loads of mixed produce in the north building, with a fair delivery on the basket market. Trade was good, with prices high, considering the season of the year.

Oats—One hundred bushels sold at \$17 to \$18 per ton. Hay—About ten loads of hay sold at \$17 to \$18 per ton.

Butter—Receipts large; prices easy for common grades and firm for choice lots made for special customers. Prices ranged from 18c to 20c, and we heard of one farmer's wife who got 20c for butter made to suit the palate of critical customers, but the bulk of the butter sold at from 18c to 20c per lb. and good butter at 20c per lb.

Eggs—Prices were firm at 25c, the bulk selling at that, and 26c was reported by the same farmer. One of the best butter to a special customer who was willing to pay almost any figure providing the eggs were fresh.

Poultry—Receipts light, but plenty to supply the demand at present prohibitive prices. Spring chickens sold at 20c to 22c per lb., and one farmer presented a few small chickens at 40c per lb., but the bulk of the best sold at 20c. Old fowl sold at 10c per lb. Spring ducks are worth about 20c per lb., although one or two lots of choice quality brought 22c per lb.
