EMBARGO REPORTS CUT WHEAT PRICE
Chicago Market Loses Over Four Points Before Rallying.
EXPORT SALES LARGE
British Government Buys Much Wheat Independent of Pit.
Chicago, Nov. 22.—Authoritative announcement that legislation for an embargo on foodstuffs would have substantial backing in Congress did a good deal to rally the market after a week of sharp advance in the price of wheat. After rising in some instances as much as a bushel, the market turned back and closed unsettled at net gains of 1/4 to 1/2 cent. With December at \$1.83 1/2 and May at \$1.83 1/2, corn finished 1/2 to 1/4 cent up to \$1.20. Provisions closed irregular, varying from 1/4 cent to 1/2 cent.
