Flourens, from which he draws the following conclusions:—First, that cold exercises a constant and decided action on the lungs of animals; secondly, that the effect of that action is more rapid and serious in proportion to the youth of the animal; thirdly, that when cold does not produce an acute pulmonary in-flammation, speedily mortal, it produces a chronic inflammation, which is, in fact, pulmonary consumption; fourthly, that heat constantly prevents the inroad of pulmonary consumption; that when it has actually commenced, heat suspends its progress, and that sometimes heat even leads to a perfect cure; fifthly, that to whatever height it may have arrived, this malady is never contagious.
