New York, Jan. 10—The trial of Harry K. Thaw for the murder of Stanford White, opened this morning with one new juryman as the net result of a day's work. Twice the jury box was filled jesterday and twice it was partially emptied again and this morning the attorneys face the threat of court seesions on Saturday unless they complete the jury before ten o'clock tonight. It is not usual to hold court sessions on Saturday, and the attorneys on both sides had counted on having time tomorrow to take a final look over the evidence, as there will be no time after the jury is completed. A fifth panel of 100 veniremen was present when court convened this morning and it is hoped, but not expected, that the five remaining jurymen may be found among those newly summoned. So far 400 men have been examined the remaining ninety having been either excused by the court or not found by the officers serving the summonses. Of the three hundred and ten examined seven remain in the jury box, nineteen were excused on peremptory challenges by the defence, fourteen on the peremptories of the prosecution and 270 were allowed to look into the workings of the act in the provinces.
