It also appears, by repeated ex-perience, that cold does not extend to more than two years at a time. Again, if the winter excess of east wind be great, in the first instance, the winter will be mild, and followed by mild summers ; while the summer excess of east wind is itself, in the first instance, always mild; but uniformly followed by cold winters and cold summers, which continue, more or less, for one or two years, according to circum-stances.— Magazine of Natural History. 
