spect of proe has spent within this  ${f not}$  exceeded \$579 per annum, although he has for some years presided over an extensive mission district; and whereas, his inadequate support in the past now leaves him without financial means in this his serious illness; and whereas, his claim on the Superannuation Fund is but \$110 per annum, being altogether inadequate for his pressing wants; and whereas, it is highly desirable that he should have such medical and surgical aid as can be obtained only at an institution such as Clifton Springs Sanitarium; and whereas, this illness was incurred through exposure necessitated while engaged in official duties;

"Resolved,-That this Conference most strongly urge the Board of Missions to grant Rev. T. B. Beynon, B.A., the sum of five hundred dollars.

The above resolution was presented by Rev. J. J. Leach, Secretary of Stationing Committee, and unanimously adopted by the Conference.

## Re Close of Financial Year.

Moved by Rev. W. A. Vrooman, seconded by J. H Smith, and Resolved,—That the Conference financial year shall close on all circuits and missions, May 15th.

## Re Unity in Doctrine and Practice.

Moved by Rev. J. M. A. Spence, seconded by U. S. Jory, and Resolved,—That whereas, it is important to conserve the unity and peace of the Church; and whereas, we have reason to believe that certain doctrinal views have been taught, and certain practices indulged in, which have resulted in disunion and strife; this annual Conference recommends that wherever, on any of our circuits, any of our ministers or official members have knowledge of any such preaching or practices, they report the same to the Chairman of the District in which they occur in order that an investigation may be held, and, if necessary, a charge preferred.

Re Connexional Funds. Moved by Rev. John Maclean, seconded by M. H. Fieldhouse, and Resolved,—That the Conference instruct superintendents and probationers to pay all their funds, except the Missionary, Superannuation and General Conference, to their respective Financial Secretaries as soon as received, and that Financial Secretaries pay the amounts received from Circuits and Missions to the several Conference Treasurers, in order that a uniform financial system may be adopted and complications avoided in

the management of our funds.

Moved by Rev. Dr. Maclean, seconded by Rev. G. R. Turk, and Resolved,—That the Theological Union respectfully request the Conference to call the attention of the Chairmen of Districts to the great importance of preserving facts relating to the establishment and development of Methodism within the bounds of the Conference, and to recommend them to record in permanent form in books annually supplied them, under the direction of the Historian of the Theological Union, all matters of historical interest belonging to Manitoba and North-West Methodism.
