## THE LEGISLATURE

In the legislature on Thursday the bill to authorize a grant of land to Percy W. Thomson, after making the grant direct to the New Brunswick Power Company, was agreed to.

The municipalities committee met at 8.30 and continued in session until 6.45. It considered the bill to re-establish the common council in St. John, instead of the commission form of government, also a bill to compel owners of real estate in St. John to file plans of the same with the assessor.

The house adjourned until 8.30 o'clock on Tuesday evening.

## MORNING NOTES OF THE WAR

The British steamer Seven Seas, was torpedoed without warning off Beachy Head on Thursday afternoon. Eleven of the crew of eighteen were drowned. A successful attack with bombs was made by British aviators on German submarines at Hoboken and Zebrugge, Belgium, on Thursday morning. The second engineer was the only officer saved.

The most satisfactory loaves are those that contain thirty per cent or less of potato flour. The bread, so made, retains its moisture and freshness and is appealing in flavor. American housekeepers have long used some potato flour in bread-making, principally for the reason that the loaf retains its moisture and freshness longer than if made wholly of wheat flour.
