MISS BOURNE SLEPT
GLAD LIKE MUMMY

Nurse Testifies Patient was
Rolled in Many Layers of
Wool and Flannel.

New York, May 28.—Miss Annie Cunningham, who for fourteen years until 1918 nursed Miss Emily Howland Bourne, was a witness before Surgeon General F. C. Wood in a suit brought by Miss Bourne's niece, Mrs. Helen A. P. Merriman of Providence, to set aside the will of Miss Bourne leaving the bulk of her \$1,000,000 to another niece, Mr. Emily M. Howland, of Greenwich, Conn. Miss Cunningham testified for the contestants. She told of attentions given to Miss Bourne by the late Dr. John A. Wyeth, head of the Polytechnic Hospital, while Miss Bourne was in that institution from 1915 to 1918.

Miss Cunningham testified that for a number of years it had been Miss Bourne's custom to spend a few months at her old home at New Bedford, Mass., where her father, Jonathan Bourne, was a pioneer whaler and made a fortune. In December, 1915, Miss Bourne broke her arm and went to Polytechnic Hospital for treatment. She remained there until the Fall of 1918, when the Government took over the hospital.

The witness said that Dr. Wyeth attended Miss Bourne and later moved to the hospital himself. After Miss Bourne had been there about a year she bought Dr. Wyeth a car and he and was accustomed to take rides in it with him or with his sister or a nurse, the witness said.

Miss Cunningham testified that she saw Miss Bourne and Dr. Wyeth together frequently and that Miss Bourne was accustomed to refer to Dr. Wyeth as "my dear Parallel." She explained that this meant they were two persons of the same mind. The witness said that Dr. Wyeth used the same term toward Miss Bourne. He read poems and stories to her and also read from the manuscript of a book he was writing.

The witness said that Miss Bourne commissioned Gutson Gorgum to do a bust of Dr. Wyeth and that she accompanied Miss Bourne when she went to the studio to look at the bust. Miss Bourne complained about the appearance of the neck and shoulders, insisting that they were not correctly done, and made the same complaint when the bronze bust was finished, the witness said. Miss Cunningham said that she did not know what had become of the bust.

The witness said that under the will which she is helping to contest she got an annuity of \$100, or \$1,000 in cash outright. When asked if she felt any ill will toward Miss Bourne, she said: "I have no feeling against her. I hope she is in the highest chair in Heaven, if there is such a place."

Miss Cunningham went on to tell that when Miss Bourne was in New Bedford she slept rolled up in four to six blankets, both summer and winter. In addition to the bed clothing, she wore a flannel shirt under a flannel nightgown, and over this was a shorter flannel garment. She pinned woolen sleeves to the shoulders of this garment, and after she had put on a flannel kimono she was rolled up in the blankets by her nurse and then was ready for sleep. She slept with the windows open, even in winter, and occasionally complained of being too cold.

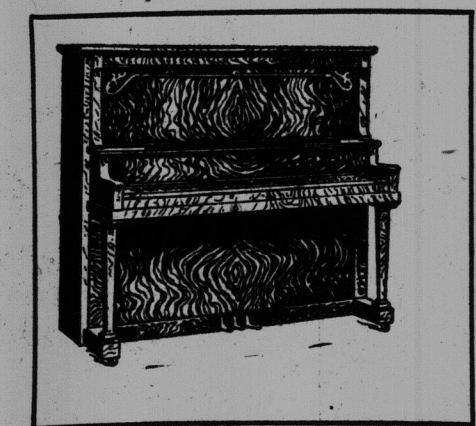

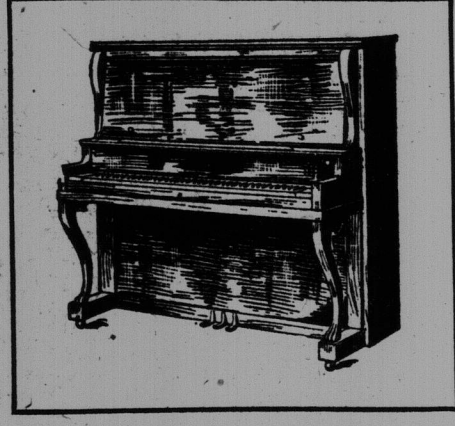
