GENERAL UPRISING NOW FEARED IN

UPPER SILESIA

(Canadian Press.)

Oppeln, Silesia, Jan. 24—The entire population of Upper Silesia is armed with rifles, revolvers and machine guns and is well supplied with ammunition, which the entente military forces and the plebiscite police are hesitating to seize in the fear of a general uprising, said a member of the inter-allied commission here today. Widespread terrorizing and fighting between the Germans and Poles during and after the forthcoming plebiscite cannot be prevented, this member declared, without serious clashes between the troops of occupation, the police and civilians.
