EARTHQUAKES AT RATE OF NEARLY THREE A WEEK

Victoria, B. C., Jan. 3.—During the last year an abnormal number of earthquakes has been recorded upon the seismographs in the Gonzales Heights observatory. The total was 141, or an average of nearly three a week, the greatest annual number recorded here since 1898. During the last 22 years nearly 1,900 earthquakes have been recorded here from various parts of the world.
