MURDERED YOUTH WALL STREET BOY

Lad Who Disappeared With \$178,000 in Liberty Bonds a Few Weeks Ago

New York, Sept. 9.—A photograph of a youth found murdered in Milford, Conn., several weeks ago was identified yesterday at New York police headquarters as that of Benjamin M. Binkowitz, a Wall street messenger boy, who, according to the police, disappeared on Aug. 12 with \$178,000 worth of Liberty bonds entrusted to him for delivery by his employers, Whitney & Co., bankers and brokers.

A nation-wide search was begun for the boy after his disappearance. Soon afterwards the Milford murder occurred. Working on the theory that the stranger had been slain for the bonds he is alleged to have had in his possession, Detective Frank Virel of the Connecticut state police, came here to establish identification. The boy's mother, when shown the photograph, declared it was that of her son.
