"Fruitatives" Alone Gave Him L a d Who Disappeared With \$178,000 in Liberty Bonds a Few Weeks Ago

New York, Sept. 9—A photograph of a youth found murdered in Milford, Conn., several weeks ago was identified yesterday at New York police headquarters as that of Benjamine M. Binkowitz, a Wall street messenger boy, who, according to the police, disappeared on Aug. 12 with \$178,000 worth of Liberty bonds entrusted to him for delivery by his employers, Whitney & Co., bankers and brokers.




