Then Would Be Peace

Sofia., Dec. 26—Diplomatic relations between Servia and Bulgaria have been resumed.

The second Balkan war grew out of quarrels over the division of territory among the allies, after they had conquered the Turks in Europe. Servia was the first to turn on Bulgaria, and was followed by Greece and Roumania. Montenegro also declared hostility to Bulgaria, but did not actually fight. Bulgaria accepted Roumania's conditions and agreed to the terms of peace proposed by Servia and Greece, last July.




