

IN FRENCH CHALLIS



all-over lace for the overskirt and 1/2 yard satin or moire for the belt.
Begin the construction with the foundation, first pleating the back gore. Crease on double "oo" perforations, bring folded edge to single perforations and stitch. Join gores as notched. Pleat lower edge of seam, bringing "T" perforations together at seam and tack. Close center-back seam from large "O" perforation to lower edge, finish edges above for placket. Form inverted pleat, creasing on slot perforations, bring folded edge to center-back seam; stitch from upper edge to small "o" perforation, tack lower edge to position and press. Close back seam of source, gather upper edge between double "T" perforations. Turn under lower edge 1/2 inches for hem. Sew to lower edge of foundation, centers even, small "o" perforation at side seam.

The applied front is an attractive feature of the skirt. For this first gather upper edge between double perforations.



"T" perforation. Turn hem at lower edge on small "o" perforation. Adjust to position on foundation, stitching upper edges together, centers even bring the three small "o" perforations at side edge to corresponding perforations in front gore and tack.
Now place upper edge of placket, bringing "T" to corresponding small "o" perforations, forming inverted pleat at hip. Close seam under pleat as notched. Close center-front under pleat as notched. Close center-front and center-back seams, leaving back seam free above double "oo" perforations for placket and leave edges free below small "o" perforations. Arrange on foundation, centers even; stitch upper edges together. Bring single large "O" perforation in placket to corresponding perforation in back gore and tack. Adjust a webbing or a straight strip of canvas two inches wide to position underneath upper edge of skirt for a stay; stitch upper edges together. The belt may be finished with a butterfly bow or a sash.

A dainty color scheme is worked out in this frock of cream colored challis printed with pink flowers and trimmed with pink satin and lace.

Next to silk and wool crepe, which is sometimes expensive, floral printed French challis is the material par excellence for making dressy summer frocks that vary from the tub models. To make this dress requires 5 yards of 48-inch challis, 3 yards of 17-inch silk for the blouse, 3 yards of 48-inch




