PHONE HEARING OFF; EXPERTS TO REPORT

The board of public utilities, in session yesterday afternoon, enquiring into the application of the New Brunswick Telephone Company to shorten its hours for reduced rate telephone messages, considered that before it could decide satisfactorily on the issue it was necessary to know what the cost to the telephone company would be to increase its operating efficiency and lines so as to eliminate the peak load after 6 o'clock. In order to secure this evidence it was decided to adjourn the session until Wednesday, February 27, when the company is asked to place at the disposal of the board all the evidence in its possession in order to throw additional light upon the subject. Chairman Otty explained that at the

adjourned hearing those opposed to the application of the company would be given the privilege of cross-examining the company's witnesses. If any doubt is left in the minds of the members of the commission as to the sufficiency of the evidence, added Chairman Otty, to enable the company to take care of this peak load, then the board will consider the employment of experts to look into the entire matter.

War Menus

How to Save Wheat, Beef and Bacon for the men at the front. Issued from the Office of the Food Controller for Canada.

MENU FOR MONDAY.

Breakfast: Oatmeal Porridge, Fish Croquettes, Rye Bread and Butter, Tea or Coffee.
Dinner: Roast Mutton, Creamed Celery, Cornmeal Potatoes, Communal and Apple Pudding, Supper: Cream of Tomato Soup, Crackers.
Oatmeal Muffins, Stewed Prunes, Tea.

The recipe for Communal and Apple Pudding, mentioned above, is as follows: Stir three level teaspoonsful of baking powder thoroughly into one cupful of sugar, and add this mixture to one quart of freshly made mush, following with two cups of pared and sliced apples, two tablespoons of butter and a well-beaten egg. Turn into a greased mold and steam for two hours. Serve hot with lemon sauce. (Wheat and meat saving recipes by Domestic Science Experts on staff of the Food Controller's Office.)

FOOD CONTROLLER MEANS BUSINESS

Ottawa, Jan. 26.—The new food controller, H. B. Thompson, will, it is understood, follow up the preliminary educational campaign of his predecessor, Mr. Hanna, with a series of concrete and drastic restrictive regulations stopping food waste and meeting as far as possible the urgent demands of the Allies for food supplies for Canada. So far, with the exception of the regulations giving meatless days in hotels and public eating places, there has been comparatively little done beyond exhortation to the public to conserve, cut down consumption and eliminate waste. The new controller believes the time has come for further compulsory regulation in the way of rationing. There is little prospect of increasing production this year sufficiently to meet even in any approximate way the food requests of the Allies to Canada. The only other way of supplying the need is by saving twenty-five per cent. or more of the normal domestic consumption, thus increasing the exportable surplus by that amount. United States Food Controller Hoover will deal in a similar way with food consumption across the border and regulations in Canada and the United States will be co-ordinated, according to mutual requirements and objects. CIVIL SERVICE UPSET.

Report of Longer Working Hours Creates Contention at Ottawa.

Civil service clerks, in Ottawa, have been perturbed by a report that it is the intention of the government to increase the working hours of the service. While the hours of labor vary in the departments, the majority of civil servants are on duty from 8:15 a. m. to 6 p. m., with an hour and a half for lunch. It is said that the new hours will be from 8:30 a. m. to 6 p. m., with an hour only at lunch. No official announcement is yet forthcoming from the government, but the adoption of the longer hours as a war measure would not occasion much surprise. The longer hours would probably make it possible for the government to dispense with a number of temporary employees, thereby effecting a considerable economy and prevent for some time any increase in the number of permanent officials.
