BIGGER PLANT FOR HALIFAX

Dominion Coal Company to Build Towers and Otherwise Increase Facil-

It is announced that the Dominion Coal Ecompany is to enlarge its Halifax plant and three ninety foot towers will be set up on rails on the face of the wharf. They will permit of seven times as much work as with the old derricks.

All the existing sheds will be swept that the swept that the swept that the swept that the coal heap in the rear and a 66-foot bound receted midway on each of these towers will control the cars to and from the vessel at the wharf. Attached to each bound will be a clam shovel which will hold at least a ton of coal.

With the three towers working steadily 200 tons of coal can be taken out of a vessel every hour, as compared with the old plant which seldom gets more than 15 tons out in ten hours. In bunkering 1,500 tons a hatch can be stowed in ten hours as against 200 tons under the old system. Those now in use at Montreal and St. John.
