SYDNEY TO SEND BOXER TO FINALS

Cape Bretoners Peevish Because "Fighting Cop" Not Selected.

Sydney is peevish regarding alleged bad treatment handed out to James Cruickshank, their "Fighting Cop," by the Maritime selection committee. Cape Bretoners apparently had the idea that whoever won here at the Maritime boxing eliminations would be sent to Montreal, whereas Mr. Covey and his officials have time and again said that their policy was to select only those men they felt stood a fairly good chance of winning. Having beaten the highly-touted Dave Nolan, Maritime champion, Sydney expected the "Fighting Cop" would be among those present at the festivities in Toronto, being sent there at the expense of the Maritime committee. After detailing fully the facts, the Sydney Post winds up as follows:

"It may be pointed out here that Sydney subscribed over \$200 to the Maritime Olympic funds, the showing of this city being one of the finest in the Maritime Provinces, yet the officials in charge of our Olympic athletes have apparently forgotten the efforts of the amateur sport leaders here, and the fans in general.

"Sydney now has five amateur clubs affiliated with the M. P. B. A. A. U. of C. This city is coming back to the amateur sport, after a decade or more of inertia. The men behind these clubs will not submit to the kind of dictation which Mr. Covey and his officials seem so anxious to impose on the Cape Breton amateur. When the next meeting of the M. P. B. A. U. of C. is called, I expect to see Sydney delegates present in force and a show-down will be asked for.
