The Indian Department takes a Philosphic View of It. MR. FISHER'S ENGLISH VISIT.

On the Whole His Mission Has Been Highly Satisfactory—Protest Against the Embargo on Canadian Cattle—Discuss—Establishing Remount Stations in Canada With Lord Roberts—Horses for Army.

Ottawa, Aug. 7.—The Indian Department has received a report from Mr. John P. Wright, its agent at Fort Frances, Ont., giving details of a recent seizure of a gasoline launch containing five Americans, for selling liquor to the Indians, and the subsequent escape of the prisoners in the launch to the United States side.

Mr. Fisher's English Visit. The Minister of Agriculture arrived in the city last evening from his trip to England. On the whole his mission there has been satisfactory.

Mr. Fisher had an agreeable talk with Lord Roberts upon the question of establishing remount stations in Canada, and he also impressed upon a War Office committee the advantage of relying upon Canada to supply for army necessities.
