> Buffalo, N. Y., Dec. 3.—Hon. John Charlton, M.P., of Lyndoch, Ont., ar-rived in Buffalo at 11 o'clock this morning, and was met at the station by a committee of the Merchants' Exchange. Mr. Charlton was tendered a standing uncheon at noon on the floor of the Merchants' Exchange, Mr. Charlton spoke on "Reciprocity with Canada," a topic in which the exchange has been taking an active interest, and in the interests of which the exchange sent a delegation to appear before President Roosevelt. He sums up the tariff situ-

"The condition of trade matters be tween the two countries may be briefly summarized as follows: The Canadian tariff is one-half that of the United States. Canada buys of the United States three-fold as much as her sales to that country of farm produce and general imports. Canada has opened for herself other markets, and the chief market for her products now is Great Britain. Canada derives her chief sup-ply of manufactures from the United States. The condition of trade between the two countries is so inequitable that great dissatisfaction prevails in Canada and that country will not be contented pediments to the entry of imports from the United States and is practically excluded from the market of that country. The American tariff can be copied by Canada and a kind of reciprocity thereby be secured that will minimize American trade and give it the shrunken proportion now characteristic of the Cana-
