### STRANGE LOSS OF MEMORY. ondon Doctor Knews Cases Equal

Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde.

Are there in actual existence cases
of "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde?" A of "Dr. Jekyl and Mr. Hyde?" A remarkable article in the current number of The Practitioner by Sir George Savage, lecturer on mental diseases at Guy's Hospital, seems to indicate that phenomena of dual personality approaching very nearly Stevenson's famous phantasy are occasionally discovered by those whose studies bring them in contact with the mysteries of the abnormal human mind.

mind.

The article is entitled "Automatism," which the writer defines broadly as "the condition in which complicated mental processes give rise to complicate divides his cases of more serious automatism into three groups. In the first there is no epilepsy, in the second fits are followed by automatic acts, and in the third replaced by them. He gives two terrible instances of the first two groups. In one a man killed his wife, in the other a mother wounded her child with a knife. Both man and woman were unconscious of what they were doing.

"In the third group," continues the writer, "we find cases like that of a certain country squire of middle age, of healthy active habits, with no hereditary history of any neuritis, who came to London to consult his solicitor on a certain Tuesday morning. The lawyer asked him to call again at three o'clock. He did not return, but finding himself near his lawyer's office some days later about half-past three, 'he went there, believing the day still Tuesday and that he was only half an hour late as a result of his watch having stopped. He could not believe that the hour was half-past three and the day Friday. He then recogned that he had not shaved, but he seemed to have washed, dressed and eaten regularly. He certainly had not been drinking. He could not race where he had been or what he had been nothing abnormal in his senditat to lead any one to suppose him to be out of his mind."

Not the least interesting part of this extraordinary question of automatism, dual personalty, loss of memory — whatever may be the correct title for each instance—is its legal aspect, and how far the author of crimes committed while in an abnormal state is amenable to the criminal law. To what extent must Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde suffer for the misdee

New Lifeboat Rules.

Revised rules for life-saving appliances at sea have just been issued by the British Board of Trade. A table showing the number of davits which must be provided specifies what number must be carried on vessels of various lengths. The vessels under 160 feet in length must carry two davits. Vessels between 245 and 270 feet must carry six davits. Those of from 360 to 390 feet, ten davits; vessels of from 450 to 510 feet, fourteen davits. Those from 590 to 670 feet must carry eighteen davits, etc.; those from 750 to 840 feet, twenty-two davits, and vessels from 940 to 1,040 feet must carry twenty-six davits. The number of lifeboats or approved substitutes therefor must provide a seat for every passenger. New Lifeboat Rules.

### Nova Scotia Steel & Coal

Lower Iron Ore Beds at Wabana Found to be Practically Inexhaustible

Developments Show One of the Most Important Deposits Known-Quality Superior to That of Any Ore. Uncovered on the Property—Lower Bed Seems Shaped Like a Saucer Enough in Sight to Last Centuries.

(From Wall Street Journal.)

One of the most important discoveries made in recent years on any of the iron ere areas situated in Canada has been made during the past few months on the lower beds of the areas of the Nova Scotia Steel & Coal Co. at Wabana. The results of these discoveries go to prove that Wabana is undoubtedly one of the most important iron ore deposits in the world.

Scotia Co.'s submarine slopes driven seaward from the upper bed, and as the work advanced bore holes were sunk from the up-pen beds to the lower beds, in order that the company might have pen beds to the tower beds, in order tass, the company might have an opportunity of testing the quantity and quality of the underlying ore. The results obtained from the last bore holes have been perfectly satisfactory, proving as they do that the dig increase in thickness of the seam after it dips under the sea, as shown by the former bore holes, is fully maintained. This seam in the submarine areas is 20 to 30 feet thick, as against 11 or 12 feet thick on the land.

What is most important, however, from the company's standpoint as also from the point of view of the shareholders, is that the
quality of the ore is far superior to anything previously found on the
company's deposits. The average iron contents of the entire
thickness of the seam is over 55 p.c. This is 3 p.c. or 4 p.c.
higher than 'the results obtained from the previous bore holes.
In fact, some of the ore on the new seam shows as high as 68 p.c.
Perhaps even more important than the increased percentage of iron
in the ore is the decrease in the ellicum. Previous tests of this
bed before it entered the areas of the Scotia Co. had shown as high n the ore is the decrease in the ellicum. Previous tests of this sed before it entered the areas of the Scotia Co. had shown as high as 16 p. c. of silicum. The average was 12 p. c. or 13 p. c., but in the last bore hole it was found that on the lower bed the silicum is down to about 9 p. c., which makes it nearly ideal for blast furnace purposes. The indications are that the ore will be of even better quality as it goes deeper.

While there was never any doubt as to the continuity of this lower bed, this last bore hole has proved that it extends for a further 1,000 feet in the Scotia areas. The submarine development has shown that this lower bed in the Scotia holdings, which is approximately 20 feet thick, has so far been proven to be over 3,000 feet wide, and its estimated length is about eight or ten miles. The lower bed is supposed to be shaped like a sancer, and at the present time the operators of the company have only crept down a very short distance along one of the rims towards the centre.

FAMOUS FALSE STARTS.

Men of Genius Who Began In the Weeng Groove.

Your butcher, your baker, your candlestick-maker never mistakes his vocation; believing in the value of experience, he starts young, and sticks to his job. On the other hand, it is a remarkable fact that men of genius rarely start life in their proper groove. They are the rolling-stones, though whether or not they gather mosa is another matter. It would seem to be the rule that a man of genius must spend a large part of his life doing some incompatible task, wearing himself out in some irksome profession or trade, before the discovery of his real bent is vouchsafed.

Look at Goldsmith, for example. He was at the same time one of the greatest literary men and one of the

Look at Goldsmith, for example. He was at the same time one of the greatest literary men and one of the worst doctors that ever lived. Unfortunately, his medical experience came first Sir Johus Reynolds' canvases rarely come into the market in these days, but when they do, people jostle each other for the right to pay thousands of pounds for them—and the artist's father gave his brilliant son an education that was devised to serve him in the capacity of medical practitioner!

Similarly, Darwin, the king of naturalists, studied medicine at Edinburgh; the results, however, were so unsatisfactory that he diffect to Cambridge with an eye on the church. It was only at the end of his career there (which he himself described as "reckless") that he became serious, and, as we know, brilliantly scientific. The case of Sir A. Conan Doyle indicates that the old order changes not; for he actually practiced eight years in Southsea before putting aside the scalpel for the pen.

Many instances are on record of men originally intended for the church turning to secular occupations. Darwin was one of these. Burne-Jones, in his own day a leader of a new art movement, only took to painting pictures when his theological education was far advanced. In so much as a great deal of his artistic work is characterized by a strong religious note, it would seem that his discarded profession became a useful factor in that which he finally adopted. Constable,

Constable, one of the bright particular stars of English landscape painting, was in similar case. Before devoting himself to art, however, he served a term as a miller in his father's business.

Many men spend their lives in businesses with the secret conviction that their real aptitude lies in some particular profession; a few, with the courage of their convictions, actually risk everything in the attempt to do the work they can enjoy. To this class belong George Alexander, the well-known actor, and G. R. Sims, the equally well-known journalist, both of whom toiled (with considerable success) in the first instance in the city.
