"Advance" Scientific Miscellany. Some experiments were lately made in a Russian town with fire-extinguishing powder.

Prof. Stillman has excavated, at Gnosno, in Crete, the remains of what he supposes to be the historical labyrinth famous from the story of Theseus and the Minotaur.

Concerning the moon's effect on tides, the Astronomer Royal for Ireland recently stated that, while the day is gradually lengthening through lunar action on the tides, the earth's rotation on its axis is retarded.

Among the many practical applications of Farne's electrical accumulators suggested, is that of using them for utilizing the waste of water power during the hours when such power is not employed in ordinary work, as at night, etc.
