England by the Parisian.

After twelve years' unrestricted
and undetected housebreaking and
robbing on a gigantic scale, Laurent
Belarue, called the "king of burglars,"
has been arrested in Paris.

of the department of the Seine and
the Oise have been amazed by the

During these twelve years no hint
of the identity or number of the
robbers ever was secured. Now it
is learned that one man did the

years old and ready to pay the pun-
ishment of his crimes.

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
