A BUSY SCOTT ACT
MONTH IN MONCTON.
(Moncton Times.)

The Scott Act business is on the boom here at present. This morning yesterday afternoon, Tim Thibault and Adelaire Arsenault were convicted of C. T. A. violation and each fined \$50 a month. This is Arsenault's second conviction within a comparatively short time. This makes a total of 11 Scott Act convictions during the current month. The police say that there is no particular reason for the epidemic of Scott Act violation. The business waxes and wanes without any apparent cause. One month later will be almost no convictions and the next there will be a conviction almost every day. The present month, however, threatens to beat all previous records.
