GRAIN TRAINS ARRIVE. During the last twenty-four hours several special grain trains from the west have arrived. Over 200,000 bushels were taken into the elevator at the west side on Saturday. The steamer Commodore Commerce took 192,000 bushels on Sunday for Manchester. Large shipments will go forward by the steamers now in port.

ALLAN LINE. The next Royal mail steamer will be the Corlaan, on the Allan line. She left Dec. 20 for St. John via Halifax.

SKIPPER FOR EVOLUTION. Captain John Rafuse, mate of the Mary Hendry, has signed on as master of the schooner Evolution, now at Liverpool loading pulp for Lynn. The Evolution has just been overhauled at Liverpool, being managed by the Sable River Lumber Company.

ARRIVAL OF BIG CRAFT. Canadian six-masted schooner Everett G. Griggs reached Calais, Peru, from Sydney, Australia, on Dec. 9th, concluding a voyage lasting nearly 30 months. The Everett G. Griggs is a vessel of 2,577 tons displacement, the largest of her class in the world, and is commanded by Captain E. R. Sterling, a native of Halifax, who is also the owner. She is built of steel and has complete wireless equipment, while her sails are worked by machinery.

WOMAN LEAPS OFF STEAMSHIP. Fall River, Mass., Dec. 23.—A woman committed suicide early today by jumping from an upper deck of the steamship Priscilla, bound for this city. A brown seakoin coat, a handkerchief and the key of the stateroom found near the wheel house, led to the discovery of the act. When the stateroom was immediately opened the woman who had registered for it in New York last night was missing. On one of the walls of the stateroom was written in pencil: "I jumped overboard at half-past nine. Notify Fred Butcher, Fourth avenue, New York."

AT EVERY DAY CLUB

At the Every Day Club yesterday afternoon Walter Brindle gave an impressive talk to men and boys on the life and temple of Him whose birth is the theme of rejoicing this week. George Scott spoke briefly of the great work opening up in connection with the boy of the club.

In the evening Rev. J. A. MacKegan told in a simple yet dramatic manner, Masterline's story of The Blue Bird, or the quest for happiness, and interpreted it clearly for his audience. A BUSY SCOTT ACT MONTH IN MONCTON. (Moncton Times.) The Scott Act business is on the boom with a vengeance this month. Yesterday afternoon, Tim Thibideau and Adelaire Arsenault were convicted of C. T. A. violation and each fined \$20 a month. This is Arsenault's second conviction within comparatively short time. This makes a total of 11 Scott Act convictions during the current month. The police say that there is no particular reason for the epidemic of Scott Act violation. The business waxes and wanes without any apparent cause. One month there will be almost no convictions and the next there will be a conviction almost every day. The present month, however, threatens to beat all previous records.

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
